Rule 18

EXISTING

RULE 18 - OFFICERS AND OFFICIALS

The officers of the Regional Association shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Regional Association each year and shall remain in office until the termination of the next Annual General Meeting.

a. The Officers of the Regional Association shall consist of: **Patron, President, Snr. Vice-President, Jnr. Vice-President, Administration Secretary, Treasurer**, who need not be delegates to the Regional Association. There shall also be an office to be known as "**Immediate Past President**", which shall automatically be held by the person who most recently held the office of President of the Regional Association. Nominations for the Office of: Patron, President, Snr. Vice-President, Jnr. Vice-President, Administration Secretary, Treasurer, Registrar, Selectors, Members of Management Committee, Technical Committee, Finance Committee, Public Relations Committee, Vacancy on Life Membership and Blazer Committee shall close with the Association's Administration Secretary on 1st May in each year and shall be promptly circulated to all Clubs at least four weeks prior to the Annual General Meeting. Nominations must be submitted on a prescribed form (Schedule D) and shall contain the nominee's signature by way of consent. If for any reason whatsoever no nominations be received for all or any of the above offices then in that event it shall be competent for the Annual Meeting to fill any office for which no nominations have been received. The failure of the Administration Secretary or any other Officer of the Association to circulate nominations to Clubs as above provided for shall not invalidate any nominations lodged with the Regional Association on or before the 1st May.

Rule 20

EXISTING

RULE 20 - LIFE MEMBERSHIP AND AWARDS

Qualification for awards:

1. LIFE MEMBERSHIP:

- a. The Regional Association may elect to Life Membership of the Region any person who in the opinion of the Regional Association has rendered conspicuous service over a long period of time.
 - b. No person shall be eligible to be elected a Life Member unless he or she has been a member of the Regional Association either as an active swimmer and/or an Officer of the region for a period of not less than 20 years.
 - c. No officer of the Regional Association for the purpose of this rule shall mean an officer or member of the region, or an officer or committee member of a club. Any break in the continuity of the service shall be deducted from the period of service in computing the time served. Absence on war service shall not be considered a break in the continuity of service.
 - d. A candidate for Life Membership may be nominated by the Regional Association or may be nominated by a Club to the Regional Association in writing, setting out fully the grounds on which such nomination is made.
- Nominations for Life Membership shall not be called for by the Regional Association but shall be made solely at the initiative of the nominating body. Nominations must be made not later than 30th April in any year to be considered in that year.**

2. HONOURS AWARD:

Ten years after receiving the Service award provided that the holder has continued throughout that period to give service of the quality that earned the Service Award in the first place. Honours Awards may be conferred for a lesser period, on the initiative of the Life Membership and Blazer Committee to Service Award holders, for conspicuous service.

3. SERVICE AWARD:

Active service of an outstanding nature to the sport for a period of not less than 5 years.

NOMINATION:

Nomination for Life Membership, Honours Awards and Service Awards may be made by the Regional Association or a Club and shall be received by the Administration Secretary of the Regional Association not later than the 30th April in any year to be considered at the next Annual Meeting. Only the Annual General Meeting may make the award. No notice shall be given to Clubs of the closing date for applications in each year. Applications shall be referred by the Administration Secretary of the Regional Association direct to the Life Membership and Blazer committee, which shall make such recommendations as it sees fit.

The operations of the Committee shall be strictly confidential. It may approach in confidence any member or official of the Regional Association and any member or official of the Regional Association may communicate with the Committee in confidence touching any matters then under consideration by the Committee. All representations to the Committee are treated as strictly confidential. The Committee may make any inquiries it chooses in any manner it thinks fit concerning matters before it.

ELECTION:

A 60% majority of the total voting strength of the Clubs on the Regional Association will elect new award holders, from the favourable recommendations of the Life Membership and Blazer Committee.

PRIVILEGES:

1. Life Membership:

- a. Life Member shall have the right of entry free of charge to any meeting held under the laws of SNZ.
- b. A Life Member shall not, unless he is otherwise qualified, have the right to vote, but he shall have the right to speak.
- c. A Life Member shall have the right to wear a Life Member's Blazer.

2. Honours Award:

He/she shall be entitled to wear the lettering "Honours Award" beneath the monogram.

3. Service Award:

He/she shall be entitled to wear the lettering "Service Award" beneath the monogram.

REMITTS:

Rule 20.

3. SERVICE AWARD

- (a) Active service of an outstanding nature to the sport in the Canterbury West Coast region for a period of not less than 5 years.
- (b) Nominees must be current registered members of the region.

Rationale:

- (a) Nominees must have been active in the region and service outside the region will not count.
- (c) Nominees must be been and are currently registered to the Centre before being considered for a service award.

Moved M Morrison/G Cook Open for discussion.

J Greer mentioned about the length of time before a member gets recognised for their work. This was then further discussed by the members present and left at 5 years.

4. COACH OF THE YEAR

Each year the Life Membership and Blazer Committee will nominate a coach of the year, if applicable.

Moved M Morrison/Christine Cassin. Open for discussion and Greg explained this further. No guidelines for selection and this to be looked at. Coach to be selected each year.

5. COACHES ROLL OF HONOUR

This award is at the discretion of the life membership and blazer committee.

Moved M Morrison/Seconded G Cook. Open for discussion and Greg gave brief explanation and also that we need to recognise our coaches and this is something we have been remiss about.

Rule 30

RULE 30 - CANTERBURY WEST COAST CHAMPIONSHIPS:

4. Memorial Meet:

The following shall be the Canterbury West Coast Memorial Meet events, which may, from time to time, be altered by the regional Association:

(i) Age Groups:

(a) Boys/Girls 9 years & Under;

Events: 50m Freestyle; 50m Backstroke; 50m Breaststroke; 50m Butterfly

(b) Boys/Girls – 10 years & Under, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15 years & Over

Events: 100m Freestyle; 100m Backstroke; 100m Breaststroke; 100m Butterfly; 200 Freestyle; 100 IM; 200 IM

(c) Boys/Girls – 11 years & Under, 12, 13, 14, 15 years & Over

Events: 200 Backstroke, 200 Breaststroke,

(d) Boys/Girls 12 years & Under, 13 years & Over

Events: 200 Butterfly; 4 x 50 Freestyle Club Relay, 4 x 50 Medley Club Relay

(ii) Qualifying times will be set for this Championship by the selectors. Event standard entry times are “slower than” qualification times. Swimmers who have achieved the set time are not allowed to enter that event.

b. The winner of each event may receive either a medal/ribbon and/or a certificate, which will proclaim the competitor Titleholder for that event for that season.

All other placegetters and/or finalists shall receive such rewards as management shall from time to time decide.

B. Entry fees for Regional Championships shall be as from time to time determined by the Management Committee.

C. In lieu of conducting the Championships itself, the Regional Association may delegate the right to conduct such Championships to a Club or Clubs.

D. Any Club wishing to conduct a Regional Championship event or events shall apply to the Association in writing for permission to do so, and the Regional Assn may grant such application on such terms as it shall deem fit.

E. All swimmers in Regional Championships must be nominated by their Clubs, which shall be responsible for their entrance fees.

F. The Association reserves full power over Regional Championships events whether conducted by the Association or by a Club.

G. The members of a relay team and their order of competing shall be nominated to the Chief Recorder prior to the commencement of the session in which the race shall be swum. Any relay team member may compete in a race only once. The composition of a relay team may be altered between the heats and final of an event, provided that the entire team including four potential substitutes has been properly notified to the Chief Recorder prior to the commencement of the session in which the heats will be swum.

H. That competitors in the Canterbury West Coast Championships be permitted to swim only in their own age group as at the first day of the Championships and/or in Open events provided that swimmers may swim up in relays but only compete in one (age group) Freestyle and one (age group) Medley relay each.

Rationale Not included at present

Memorial Meet is a Canterbury West Coast Meet therefore should be included in the rules.

Rule 31

EXISTING:

RULE 31 - REGIONAL RECORDS

a. In all cases where a record performance is established, written application for the recognition of such record performance, signed by the competitor concerned or by the Secretary of the Club of which the competitor is a member must be made within 14 days from the date of the performance in respect of which such application is made as follows:

1. Records Established within Region's Boundaries.

All applications for Regional Records shall state the date the event was swum and be supported by a certificate signed by the Referee and Chief Timekeeper who shall be qualified Region officials. Except where automatic electronic timing is used, three separate manual times shall be recorded with at least two of the timekeepers being Region qualified. Only electronic watches shall be used for manual timing.

2. Records Established outside Region's Boundaries.

(i) Production of a copy of the official results of the meet signed by one of the Referees, Secretary or other Controlling Official at the meet, with the time in question highlighted and endorsed by one of the above with the words "Certified as the correct time recorded". For meets at pools, or events not known to the Region, additional requirements regarding pool or official certification may be necessary; or

(ii) A certificate as required in 1 above.

b. No performance by a swimmer shall be recognised as a Regional Record until the Regional Association has resolved it to be so recognised. Particulars of any Regional Record shall be recorded in the Minute Book of the Regional Association, and the Regional Records Officer shall keep a list of Region Records and shall from time to time revise such lists in such manner as the Association shall direct.

c. A record performance shall be recognised by the Regional Association in the form of a certificate designed for that purpose.

d. The distances to be recognised by the Regional Association for Canterbury West Coast Records shall be the distances swum at the Canterbury West Coast Championships and at the New Zealand Championships.

CANTERBURY WEST COAST RECORDS shall be recognised in three different categories:

i. Canterbury West Coast Long Course Records - where times recorded are only set in registered long course pools.

ii. Canterbury West Coast Short Course Records - where times recorded are set in pools of 33 1/3 yards, 33 1/3 meters (36 2/3 yards), all registered.

iii. Canterbury West Coast 25m Records - where times recorded are set in registered pools of 25 metres.

REMITTS:

Proposed

RULE 31 - REGIONAL RECORDS

a. In all cases where a record performance is established, written application for the recognition of such record performance must **be made within 21 days from the date of the performance or if swum outside New Zealand boundaries, within 21 days of the competitor of teams return to New Zealand** of which such application is made as follows:

1. Records Established within Region's Boundaries.

All applications for regional records shall be on the official Canterbury record application form.

Except where automatic electronic or semi automatic timing is used, three separate manual times shall be recorded **and the meet must be signed off by the Referee who shall be a qualified regional official.** Only electronic watches shall be used for manual timing.

2. Records Established outside Region's Boundaries.

(i) Manual results, The production of a copy of the official results of the meet signed by one of the Referees at the meet, with the time in question highlighted and endorsed by one of the above with the words

"Certified as the correct time recorded" For meets at pools, or events not known to the Region, additional requirements regarding pool or official certification may be necessary;

(ii) **Electronic results, Record applications must be supported by official results sheet or electronic Meet Manager / Team Manager file.**

b. No performance by a swimmer shall be recognised as a Regional Record until the Regional Association has resolved it to be so recognised. Particulars of any Regional Record shall be recorded in the Minute Book of the Regional Association, and the Regional Records Officer shall keep a list of Region Records and shall from time to time revise such lists in such manner as the Association shall direct.

c. A record performance shall be recognised by the Regional Association in the form of a certificate designed for that purpose.

d. The distances to be recognised by the Regional Association for Canterbury West Coast Records shall be the distances swum at the Canterbury West Coast Championships and at the New Zealand Championships.

e. Any age record claimed applies to the swimmers age as at the date of the swim. This also applies to the age of all swimmers in a relay team.

c. Canterbury West Coast Records shall be recognised in three different categories:

i. Canterbury West Coast Long Course Records - where times recorded are only set in registered long course pools.

ii. Canterbury West Coast 25m Records - where times recorded are set in registered pools of 25 metres.

iii Relay records for Club and, Representative Teams

d. Applications for Records should be made by the following:

Canterbury Centre Meets the Canterbury Administrator is responsible to apply for any record swims.

National Meets (including South Island Champs) Where Canterbury West Coast appoints a Team Manager it is the duty of the Team Manager to apply for any record swims.

Club Meets and other out of Region or International Meets It is the responsibility of the swimmer or their club to apply for record swims.

The above responsibilities in no way preclude any individual swimmer or club from applying for record swims and the ultimate onus at all meets falls on the swimmer and / or their Club to make application within the time period.

a. Changes in time frame allowed to apply for records brought into line with SNZ rules.

a. (1) & (2) Changes made to verification to allow for automatic timing and computerisation of meets.

b. (e) Swimmer must be correct age on date of swim, not as at start of meet

c. (iii) Removed 33 1/3 records and added relay records

d. Defined responsibilities for record applications

Moved: C Carey / M Schout. George asked that (d) be changed to show not Canterbury but Canterbury West Coast. Lesley Huckins brought up that records should be signed off by the Referee of the swim that the record was broken. Amendment to the motion that the meet must be signed off by the Referee of the session. Seconded G Cook. Amendment to the motion – carried.

CANTERBURY WEST COAST SWIMMING CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHIES

EXISTING

DUNCAN MEMORIAL SHIELD:

A challenge shield presented to the Regional Association to perpetuate the memory of the late W. H. Duncan.

RULES

1. The shield shall be known as the "Duncan Memorial Shield" and shall be competed for annually at the Div A Championships and the Championship events shall be the events on which points are allotted
2. The competition for the shield shall be open to all Clubs affiliated to the Canterbury West Coast Swimming.
3. The Club scoring the largest number of points shall be declared the winner
4. Points shall be awarded as follows: Championship Final -First, 5 points; Second, 3 points; Third, 2 points. For each unplaced finisher, 1 point.

REMITTS:

Proposed

DUNCAN MEMORIAL SHIELD:

A challenge shield presented to the Regional Association to perpetuate the memory of the late W. H. Duncan.

RULES

1. The shield shall be known as the "Duncan Memorial Shield" and shall be competed for annually at the Div A Championships, and the Championship events shall be the events on which points are allotted
2. The competition for the shield shall be open to all Clubs affiliated to the Canterbury West Coast Swimming.
3. The Club scoring the largest number of points shall be declared the winner
4. **Points shall be awarded as follows: Championship Final -First, 11 points; Second, 9 points; Third, 8 points; Fourth, 7 points; Fifth, 6 points; Sixth, 5 points; Seventh, 4 points; Eighth, 3 points; Ninth and Tenth, 1 point each**

Rationale Shows a clearer definition of scores, follows SNZ points to eight placing.

EXISTING

WHARENUI SHIELD:

A challenge shield presented to the Regional Association by the Wharenui Amateur Swimming Club.

The shield to be known as the Wharenui Shield shall be competed for annually by the Clubs affiliated to the Regional Association of SNZ.

RULES

1. The shield shall always remain the property of the Regional Association and can never be won outright.
2. The shield shall be held for one year by the Club winning it.
3. The winner of the shield shall be the winner of a six-a-side scratch relay race. Each Club team to comprise six Juniors (boys, girls or mixed). Each team member to swim one length of the pool.
4. The race shall be conducted under the rules of the SNZ.
5. The race shall be conducted at an Inter-Club Carnival held in the Wharenui Pool, Riccarton, whilst there is an affiliated swimming club operating there.

REMITTS:

Proposed

WHARENUI SHIELD:

A challenge shield presented to the Regional Association by the Wharenui Amateur Swimming Club.

The shield to be known as the Wharenui Shield shall be competed for annually by the Clubs affiliated to the Regional Association of SNZ.

RULES

1. The shield shall always remain the property of the Regional Association and can never be won outright.
2. The shield shall be held for one year by the Club winning it.
- 3. The winner of the shield shall be the winner of a 300meter six-a-side scratch relay race. Each Club team to comprise six juniors 12 and under (boys, girls or mixed). Each team member will swim 50 meters.**
4. The race shall be conducted under the rules of the SNZ.
- 5. The race shall be conducted at the Wharenui Junior Olympic Meet held annually.**

Rationale This is now a Canterbury West Coast Trophy, correction to the relay wording to ensure it is a 6 x 50m swim and reflecting that the meet is no longer held at Wharenui.
